TRANSFORMED BY THE WORD

Our church's vision is "Transforming Lives, Changing the World". And while some may think that "Transforming Lives" is a call for us to transform others' lives, it's actually a reminder for us to have our lives transformed by God. It makes sense, doesn't it? Only transformed lives can change the world — can't have it any other way.

Where then does the Word of God come in? The Word of God is an "agent" or "tool" of that transformation.

Colossians 1:6 states that "This same Good News that came to you is going out all over the world. It is bearing fruit everywhere by changing lives, just as it changed your lives from the day you first heard and understood the truth about God's wonderful grace." (NLT)

The Good News or Gospel has the power to change and transform our lives. And this shouldn't surprise us. Jesus Himself prayed to the Father for His followers in John 17:17, that

God will "Make them holy by your truth; teach them your word, which is truth."(NLT)

It is therefore our prayer and hope that this tool, Transformed by the Word may spark an exciting transformational journey for all of us as we journey through God's living Word together.

‘Transformed by the Word’ is not just another Bible reading plan or routine.

In John 1:1-4, 14, we read that the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word existed from the beginning of time even prior to creation. This Word became human and lived among people. He possessed a glory that can only be described as the glory of God. This Word that became human is Jesus Christ our Lord.

‘Transformed by the Word’ is a tool that aims to facilitate a transformative encounter with the Living Word made flesh in Jesus.

The word *“transformed”* comes from the Greek word metamorphoo. It literally means “to change into another form”. The process of a caterpillar morphing into a butterfly is a wonderful illustration of such a radical transformation.

Romans 12:2 teaches us that the renewal of our minds is the key for a transformed life. The fruit of our transformation is that we reflect the glory of God (2 Cor 3:18).

‘Transformed by the Word’ facilitates the renewal our minds through God’s Word. As we meet God daily in His Word, we catch a glimpse of the glory of God and His heartbeat. As we contemplate God’s teachings and choose to apply what we learn in our lives, the Holy Spirit produces in us the fruit of transformation that reflects His glory. What an exciting prospect!

Let us begin this journey together as a church family with an expectant heart that God will accomplish in us His work of transformation through the daily encounter of His Word.

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HOW TO USE 'TRANSFORMED BY THE WORD'

The readings are arranged in chronological order of the Bible, with Psalms and Proverbs weaved in-between to provide variety in our daily engagement with the Word. Reading in chronological order helps us grasp the big picture of God's salvation plan better.

Place and Time

Designate a regular time daily in an environment conducive to read the Bible and commune with God with minimal distraction.

Come Before God

Breathe deep and be silent. Take your time to let God quiet your mind and heart.

Begin to pray and remember you are here to encounter the Word, and to discover yourself.

The Bible

Read the Bible text slowly a few times. Take note of verses, phrases and words or big ideas that are speaking to you.

The Daily Questions

There are usually one to three questions. Listen to what God is asking you through these questions.

Note: These are not comprehension questions. They are designed to direct us into a deeper discovery of God, ourselves, and our relationships with Him and others. They will challenge us to apply God's truth into our lives with the help of the Holy Spirit.

If one of the questions is challenging you to go deeper, obey the Holy Spirit and see what He is revealing to you. The key is not in answering all the questions but in applying the Word into your life.

Other generic questions that may help you to apply the Word into your life:

1. From the passage, what aspect of your life is God revealing that requires transformation?
2. What is one thing that God is challenging you to do in your relationship with Him and with others?
3. Is there a command to obey, a sin to confess or avoid, a promise to claim, an example to follow, a truth to rejoice in, any thanksgiving to be given?

End with a prayer

Continue in a posture of silence and wait as God reveals more things or confirms your prayers. Respond to God in prayer.

Periodical Review

It is extremely beneficial to review periodically how God has transformed you and give thanks to Him. A journal is a useful tool to review your journey and growth.

Journal

Buy a good journal to record your reflections and prayers! Write or even draw what God has revealed or called you to do. Journaling is an important and useful private discipline that will help us to remember the discoveries about God, ourselves, and the applications that God is calling us to. You may also choose to journal electronically. There are many useful journaling apps that can be found in the AppStore (iOS) and the Google Play Store (Android).

Find a buddy

We are never alone in our journey of faith! Find someone to journey with you - they could be your fellow Life Group member, a family member, a close friend, or even a colleague. Share how God's Word is speaking to or transforming you, to spur and encourage each other as you continue on this journey. Hold each other accountable in the reading and application of God's Word. And remember to celebrate how God is working in both your lives! Communion with God brings much joy into our life that is worth celebrating!

Missed Readings

Missed a day or two? Don't panic. Reading the Bible is not a legalistic practice. Just read the day's designated readings and catch up on what you missed when you are able to.

Enjoy!!

Finally, enjoy your time with the Word. Like the psalmist said in Psalm 119:103 "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" May you have a daily sweet communion with God!

JANUARY 2024

PASSAGE & QUESTION



01

JAN

Jeremiah 27, 28

1. How can you ensure that you are listening to and following God's authentic guidance and not being swayed by deceptive messages?
2. How can you encourage a commitment to seeking and following God's truth among those you interact with in your faith community or personal relationships?

02

JAN

Jeremiah 29, 30

How can you trust in God's faithfulness and look forward to the restoration He promises? How can you share this message of hope with others who may be experiencing their own 'exile' moments in life?



03

JAN

Jeremiah 31, 32

How can you apply the concept of God writing His law on your heart in your own life? What acts of faith can you take, even in challenging times, to demonstrate your trust in God's promises?

04

JAN

Jeremiah 33, 34

How can you incorporate the practice of calling upon God in prayer to seek His guidance and discover "great and unsearchable things" in your own life? What specific situation or decision is God leading you to turn to Him for wisdom and insight?

How have you seen the impact of keeping or breaking promises in your relationships, whether personal, professional, or spiritual? What steps can you take to ensure that you are a person of your word and maintain the trust of others?



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PASSAGE & QUESTION

05

JAN

Jeremiah 35, 36

1. What can you learn from the Rechabites' commitment to following God's commands? How does it inspire you to honour your own spiritual or ethical traditions and principles in the face of societal pressures or temptations?
2. How can you remain steadfast in delivering God's truth, even when it faces opposition or rejection?

06

JAN

Jeremiah 37, 38

1. Jeremiah told King Zedekiah that surrendering to the Babylonians was part of God's plan and will for the people. Recall a setback or failure in your life to see how it has helped you grow in your trust and faith in the Lord. What can you learn from that experience?
2. What was King Zedekiah's main fear when he was speaking with Jeremiah in Chapter 38? When have you acted out of fear? How can you overcome this fear?

07

JAN

Jeremiah 39, 40

1. What can you learn from what happened to King Zedekiah, the nobles of Jerusalem, Jeremiah, Jerusalem, its people, and Ebed-Melek the Cushite? How should you respond?
2. God can use a dire situation for His purposes. What is God impressing on your heart and what is the next step you need to take?

08

JAN

Psalms 74

1. In times of personal or collective adversity and loss, how can you apply the psalmist's approach of turning to God with your lamentations and distress?
2. The psalmist ends his prayer by remembering God's greatness and covenant for Israel, inspiring hope. How can you praise God for his greatness and his covenant for you?



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PASSAGE & QUESTION

09

JAN

Psalm 79

The psalmist takes his feelings of anguish against the nations to the Lord in this imprecatory psalm. What are some things that are happening in the world that make you angry? Spend some time praying for the nations of the world.

10

JAN

2 Kings 24, 25

Consider the actions and reign of the last 3 kings of Judah and reflect on how God has shown you undeserved grace and faithfulness. As a recipient of God's grace, how will you in turn show grace to others?

11

JAN

2 Chronicles 36

How do God's actions reflect His faithfulness and love for the people in this chapter? How will you do the same for the people around you?

12

JAN

Habakkuk 1

1. How would you pray and serve to fight against social injustice?
2. What can you learn from Habakkuk's prayer? How might this help you to pray when God seems far away?

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PASSAGE & QUESTION

13

JAN

Habakkuk 2

1. What does Habakkuk 2 teach us when we feel that God does not make sense or that God does not seem to help?
2. How did God show that He is not blind to the evil that is happening?
3. "Deliver us from evil" - pray this for someone today.

14

JAN

Habakkuk 3

Habakkuk's prayer shows us what faith looks like as one waits. Write a declaration of your personal faith, considering your current circumstances and ongoing struggles.

15

JAN

Jeremiah 41

1. In what areas of your life do you need godly wisdom to discern truth from falsehood? Pray and ask God for wisdom (James 1:5-6).
2. Ishmael had no regard for the sanctity of human life as he selfishly sought his own gains. Where are you selfishly seeking your own interests without regard for the welfare of others? How can you make it right?

16

JAN

Jeremiah 42, 43

1. The remnant of Judah said, "Whether it is good or bad, we will obey the voice of the LORD our God (v6, ESV)." What is God telling you in this season? How can you obey Him?
2. How have you been arrogant and disobeyed God knowingly? How can you return to God in obedience? How can you make restitution to those you have wronged?



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PASSAGE & QUESTION



17

JAN

Jeremiah 44, 45

In Jeremiah 44, the people of Judah were confronted with the consequences of their persistent idolatry and refusal to heed God's warnings. How can their story serve as a cautionary tale for you in your life? In what ways can you ensure that you remain faithful to God's commands and avoid the pitfalls of idolatry and disobedience?

18

JAN

Jeremiah 46

God disciplines His people but assures them that He is with them and encourages them. What hardships are you facing now that might be God's way of disciplining you? Reflect on the possible reasons and God's purpose for the hardships and surrender to the process of God's refinement within you.



19

JAN

Jeremiah 47

We see God's judgement on the Philistines. Who are the people around you who do not yet know Jesus or are in need His mercy? Take some time to intercede for them.

20

JAN

Jeremiah 48

In what ways have you depended on your own strength and resources, instead of depending on God? How can you express your gratitude for God's providence?



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PASSAGE & QUESTION

21

JAN

Jeremiah 49

God announces judgement on several nations and uses King Nebuchadnezzar and the Babylonian army as instruments of His justice.

1. How is God's sovereignty and justice an assurance for you?
2. God promised not only judgement but also restoration. How is God's mercy expressed and how would you show mercy to people in need?

22

JAN

Jeremiah 50

1. Imagine you were one of the Israelites who grew up learning that sacrifice was required for the atonement of sins. What would your response be learning that God would forgive you without the need for sacrifices (v20)? What does that mean for you today?
2. God speaks of an everlasting covenant (v5) and promises the remnant that no iniquity will be found (v20). As believers who have experienced the forgiveness of sin through Christ, how could you share the message of forgiveness to someone who has yet to know God?

23

JAN

Jeremiah 51

How does the fall of Babylon serve as a reminder of the ultimate authority and sovereignty of God over human kingdoms and worldly powers? How will this change the way you trust in God's guidance and protection in the face of challenges and uncertainties in your life?

24

JAN

Jeremiah 52

1. Jeremiah 52 demonstrates that God's word will always prove true. Does our life reflect this truth? How will you live your life so that others can see that you are a person of the Word?
2. What does the passage tell you about God's wrath? What behaviours do you need to stop to avoid God's wrath?



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PASSAGE & QUESTION

25

JAN

Lamentations 1

How can the lamentation in this chapter cause you to reflect on the consequences of your actions and the importance of seeking forgiveness and restoration in your relationship with God? What steps do you need to take to turn away from destructive paths and embrace a life of righteousness and reconciliation?

26

JAN

Lamentations 2

1. How would you describe the state of a person when God is like an enemy to him/her (v5)? Why would God be like an enemy to this person?
2. How can you help someone who sees God as an enemy?

27

JAN

Lamentations 3:1-36

What does this passage say to give us hope in times of pain and suffering? How can you help fellow Christians to remember God's loving kindness in times of trouble?

28

JAN

Lamentations 3:37-66

Jeremiah models a framework for prayer that reminds us of God's goodness and the power to restore. Pray for God to restore the brokenness in your life and in the life of others.

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29

JAN

Lamentations 4

Much of what is happening in the world today reflects the suffering in Lamentations 4. Spend some time today praying for God's mercy and grace to be upon people afflicted by physical and spiritual illness, poverty, and hunger.

30

JAN

Lamentations 5

1. How do verses 19-22 speak to the enduring hope and reliance on God's compassion, amid adversity and suffering? How can you draw strength from this plea for restoration in times of your own difficulties and hardships?
2. Look around you. What breaks your heart? Bring them to the Lord in the form of a lamentation. Ask God for restoration in these situations. Pray also for those around you who may need God's restoration.

31

JAN

Ezekiel 1, 2

1. What would your response and posture be when confronted with God's glory?
2. When God sends us to do His work, He tells us not to be afraid. Do you live like you were sent by God? How could you be bolder in declaring God's word?

Ezekiel 4

God had a strong message for Jerusalem. How can you pray and serve in Singapore so that our city-state will not face God’s wrath?

03

FEB

Ezekiel 5, 6

1. ‘Then they will know that I am the Lord’ comes up repeatedly in Chapter 6. Even in judgement God has a purpose. How has God used unpleasant situations in your life to help you know Him better?
2. What part of your life do you need to entrust to God’s sovereignty?

04

FEB

Ezekiel 7

The Day of Judgement will come. What thoughts or feelings do you have about that? What changes could you make in preparation for that Day? What conduct and practices must you stop?

What idols do you need to remove from your heart?

FEB

Ezekiel 9

1. How do the things you idolize cause you to act unjustly? How will you make restitution for your unjust acts?
2. How can you develop greater empathy and understanding for those in your community who may be struggling with sin?

07

FEB

Ezekiel 10

1. What caused the departure of God's presence from the Temple and the people?
2. Verse 18 is a stark reminder that we need God's presence. As believers we have the Holy Spirit dwelling in us. How should you live in order not to grieve the Spirit?

08

FEB

Ezekiel 11

How does this passage prompt you to examine your heart and intentions? How can you ensure that your inner thoughts and desires align with God's righteousness? What steps can you take to foster a heart that seeks God's will and reflects His character?

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09

FEB

Ezekiel 12

What can you learn about the patience of God in v23, where it says, 'The days are near when every vision will be fulfilled (NIV)'? How does this encourage you to trust in God's timing and faithfulness in your life?

10

FEB

Ezekiel 13

What are the acts that God condemns in this chapter? How can you be discerning against false prophets and teachers?

11

FEB

Ezekiel 14, 15

1. How does the imagery of the vine and the consequences of idolatry in Ezekiel 14 and 15 relate to the importance of staying spiritually rooted and avoiding false idols in your life? What steps can you take to ensure that your faith remains steadfast and free from idolatry?
2. Have you become apathetic and unfruitful towards to God? How can you begin fulfilling His plan for you?

FEB

Ezekiel 16

1. How have you drifted away from God when you are comfortable and secure with God's blessings? What must you do to stay on course with God?
2. How does the allegory of the unfaithful bride illustrate the concept of God's grace and forgiveness in the face of human sin and betrayal? What lessons can you draw from this passage to deepen your understanding of God's love and mercy in your own life?

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PASSAGE & QUESTION

13

FEB

Ezekiel 17

What does the symbolism of the eagle and the vine reveal about God's sovereignty and His expectations for obedience and trust from His people? How can you apply the lessons from this passage to strengthen your faith and reliance on God's guidance in challenging circumstances?

14

FEB

Ezekiel 18

How does this chapter's emphasis on personal responsibility and the consequences of one's actions challenge your understanding of accountability in your life? In what ways can you take greater ownership of your choices and align them with God's principles for righteous living?

15

FEB

Ezekiel 19

The imagery of a lioness and her cubs is used to depict the downfall of Israel's rulers and leaders. How does this symbolism remind you of the importance of wise and just leadership in your life, whether in church, our communities, or organizations? What qualities do you believe are essential for effective and righteous leadership, and how can you contribute to fostering such leadership in your sphere of influence?

16

FEB

Ezekiel 20

How does this chapter emphasize the importance of obedience to God's laws and the consequences of disobedience? How will you apply these lessons to your life, prioritizing obedience to God's Word and seeking His guidance in your daily choices and actions?

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PASSAGE & QUESTION

17

FEB

Ezekiel 21

1. Do you have any secret sins that strain your relationship with God? What will you do to turn to repentance?
2. Knowing that God “disciplines the one He loves” (Hebrews 12:6) as He did with Israel, how can you maintain an attitude of humility when that happens?

18

FEB

Ezekiel 22

How can this chapter serve as a reminder of the responsibility of spiritual leadership and the importance of intentional disciple-making? What can you learn from the failures depicted in this chapter that will encourage you to be intentional in mentoring and guiding others in their faith journey today? How can you actively participate in the growth and discipleship of those around you, just as God desires you to do?

19

FEB

Ezekiel 23

What can you learn from the mistakes of Israel and Judah to maintain your spiritual purity and fidelity in your relationship with God?

20

FEB

Ezekiel 24

When have you faced challenges or had to communicate difficult messages to others? How did you respond, and what did you learn from those experiences?

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PASSAGE & QUESTION

21

FEB

Ezekiel 25

1. Where do you need to seek genuine repentance or the opportunity to make amends? Reflect on how you can actively apply the principles of accountability and justice in your personal journey of faith.
2. List the names of those whom you have been struggling to forgive and commit it to the Lord.

(Note: Remember that forgiveness is first to restore our relationship with God, not condoning their actions or reconciliation.)

22

FEB

Ezekiel 26

How can the acknowledgment of God's sovereignty over your circumstances and His ability to fulfil His plans lead to greater humility?

23

FEB

Ezekiel 27

How can you maintain a balanced perspective on material wealth and success in your own life? How will the lessons from this chapter influence your priorities, actions, and relationships with others as you navigate the challenges of a materialistic world?

24

FEB

Ezekiel 28

Excessive pride was the issue of the king of Tyre. Where are the areas you might be tempted to exalt yourself or rely too heavily on your achievements? How can you cultivate humility and recognize that all your abilities and blessings come from God? What practical steps can you take to guard against the pitfalls of pride and maintain a humble heart in your daily walk of faith?

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PASSAGE & QUESTION

25

FEB

Ezekiel 29

1. What are some versions of “Egypt” in your life that you have turned to instead of God? How can you become dependent on God instead?
2. Prepare a testimony about God’s sovereignty in your life.

26

FEB

Ezekiel 30

1. What are the reasons for God’s punishment upon the nations? How are they relevant today?
2. How will you intercede for and work towards your country’s welfare?

27

FEB

Ezekiel 31

The book of Ezekiel informs us how pride will bring about definite destruction. Think about your leaders (nation, workplace, church, etc). Instead of criticising them, consider including them in your regular prayers. How can your prayers uplift and guide them in walking and leading with God’s righteousness and humility?

28

FEB

Ezekiel 32

1. How might the themes of this chapter apply to institutions or systems today that resist God’s ways?
2. How can you apply the lessons from the downfall of these nations to your own life?

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

MAR

Ezekiel 36

How does the message of God's cleansing and renewal of His people challenge your understanding of forgiveness and second chances? In what ways can you extend this concept of renewal and grace to others in your life who may need it?

04

MAR

Ezekiel 37:1-14

Who in your life has lost their hope in God and become like these dry bones? How will you pray for them and speak life into them?

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PASSAGE & QUESTION

05

MAR

Ezekiel 37:15–28

Reflect on any divisions or disunity you may have encountered in your life, whether in your family, community, or church. What steps can you take to work towards reconciliation, unity, and harmony in those areas?

06

MAR

Ezekiel 38

How does this passage remind you of the importance of trusting in God's ultimate control over global events? What practical actions can you take to show trust in God's sovereignty, as demonstrated in Ezekiel 38? How do you see the sovereignty of God reflected in your personal experiences?

07

MAR

Ezekiel 39

1. What assurance and comfort can you find from God's promise of restoration amidst trials?
2. How does this chapter challenge your understanding of justice and mercy, and how can this influence your daily living?

Ezekiel 40

1. How does the attention to detail in the temple's design reflect your call to be detailed in your dedication to God?
2. How can you use the vision of the future temple as a metaphor to build your own 'spiritual temple' in your heart?

2. How can we diligently safeguard the purity and health of our spiritual 'eye,' as Jesus describes as the lamp of our body? In what ways can we ensure that our whole being radiates light and goodness rather than darkness?
