ur church's vision is "Transforming Lives, Changing the World".

And while some may think that "Transforming Lives" is a call for us to transform others' lives, it's actually a reminder for us to have our lives transformed by God. It makes sense, doesn't it? Only transformed lives can change the world — can't have it any other way.

Where then does the Word of God come in? The Word of God is an "agent" or "tool" of that transformation.

Colossians 1:6 states that "This same Good News that came to you is going out all over the world. It is bearing fruit everywhere by changing lives, just as it changed your lives from the day you first heard and understood the truth about God's wonderful grace." (NLT)

INTRODUCTION

'Transformed by the Word' is not just another Bible reading plan or routine.

In John 1:1-4, 14, we read that the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word existed from the beginning of time even prior to creation. This Word became human and lived among people. He possessed a glory that can only be described as the glory of God. This Word that became human is Jesus Christ our Lord.

'Transformed by the Word' is a tool that aims to facilitate a transformative encounter with the Living Word made flesh in lesus.

The word "transformed" comes from the Greek word metamorphoo. It literally means "to change into another form". The process of a caterpillar morphing into a butterfly is a wonderful illustration of such a radical transformation.



Romans 12:2 teaches us that the renewal of our minds is the key for a transformed life. The fruit of our transformation is that we reflect the glory of God (2 Cor 3:18).

'Transformed by the Word' facilitates the renewal our minds through God's Word. As we meet God daily in His Word, we catch a glimpse of the glory of God and His heartbeat. As we contemplate God's teachings and choose to apply what we learn in our lives, the Holy Spirit produces in us the fruit of transformation that reflects His glory. What an exciting prospect!

Let us begin this journey together as a church family with an expectant heart that God will accomplish in us His work of transformation through the daily encounter of His Word.

HOW TO USE 'TRANSFORMED BY THE WORD'

he readings are arranged in chronological order of the Bible, with Psalms and Proverbs weaved inbetween to provide variety in our daily engagement with the Word. Reading in chronological order helps us grasp the big picture of God's salvation plan better.

Place and Time

Designate a regular time daily in an environment conducive to read the Bible and commune with God with minimal distraction.

Come Before God

Breathe deep and be silent. Take your time to let God quiet your mind and heart.

Begin to pray and remember you are here to encounter the Word, and to discover yourself.

The Bible

Read the Bible text slowly a few times. Take note of verses, phrases and words or big ideas that are speaking to you. The Daily Questions
There are usually one to three questions. Listen to what God is asking you through these questions.

Note: These are not comprehension questions. They are designed to direct us into a deeper discovery of God, ourselves, and our relationships with Him and others. They will challenge us to apply God's truth into our lives with the help of the Holy Spirit.

If one of the questions is challenging you to go deeper, obey the Holy Spirit and see what He is revealing to you. The key is not in answering all the questions but in applying the Word into your life.


Other generic questions that may help you to apply the Word into your life:

- 1. From the passage, what aspect of your life is God revealing that requires transformation?
- 2. What is one thing that God is challenging you to do in your relationship with Him and with others?
- 3. Is there a command to obey, a sin to confess or avoid, a promise to claim, an example to follow, a truth to rejoice in, any thanksgiving to be given?









End with a prayer

Continue in a posture of silence and wait as God reveals more things or confirms your prayers. Respond to God in prayer.

Periodical Review

It is extremely beneficial to review periodically how God has transformed you and give thanks to Him. A journal is a useful tool to review your journey and growth.

Iournal

Buy a good journal to record your reflections and prayers! Write or even draw what God has revealed or called you to do. Journaling is an important and useful private discipline that will help us to remember the discoveries about God, ourselves, and the applications that God is calling us to. You may also choose to journal electronically. There are many useful journaling apps that can be found in the AppStore (iOS) and the Google Play Store (/Android).



We are never alone in our journey of faith! Find someone to journey with you - they could be your fellow Small Group member, a family member, a close friend, or even a colleague. Share how God's Word is speaking to or transforming you, to spur and encourage each other as you continue on this journey. Hold each other accountable in the reading and application of God's Word. And remember to celebrate how God is working in both your lives! Communion with God brings much joy into our life that is worth celebrating!

Missed Readings

Missed a day or two? Don't panic. Reading the Bible is not a legalistic practice. Just read the day's designated readings and catch up on what you missed when you are able to.

Enjoy!!

Finally, enjoy your time with the Word. Like the psalmist said in Psalm 119:103 "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" May you have a daily sweet communion with God!

Judges 12, 13

- 1. What is behind Jephthah's response to his own people and what does this say about his leadership? How are you similar to Jephthah at times?
- 2. Why are the events surrounding Samson's birth significant, specifically Samson being born to a woman who was both childless and barren? In what seemingly hopeless situations that you are a part of and/or that you are witnessing do you need to relentlessly cling to the hope that God is providing you?

07JAN

Judges 14

Verse 6 and 19 talk about the Spirit empowering Samson, giving him incredible strength. But he did not steward his gift well. How have you used/underused/misused God's Spirit-enabled gifts?

08 JAN

Judges 15

- 1. Who is noticeably absent from Samson's story? In what ways are you tempted to forget about God? What can you do to avoid this?
- How is Samson's leadership a reflection of Israel's attitude towards God?
 How do you avoid getting comfortable and complacent in your relationship with God?

09JAN

Judges 16

- Samson was blinded by the wrong type of love. What is blinding you to living in the ways of God?
- 2. How is God just and merciful at the end of Samson's life? How is God's justice and mercy seen in your life?

10 JAN

Judges 17

"Everyone did what was right in his own eyes" (verse 6). How is this true in today's society and in the church? How might knowing God and His Word help you do what is right according to God instead?

JAN

Judges 18


How did God feel about how His people had deviated so much from His commandments? How do you think God is feeling now as He looks at the state of our world today?

12 JAN

Judges 19

The Bible is brutally honest about sins. Take a moment to examine your life honestly. What are some sins/ sinful behaviour that God is revealing to you? What will you do about it?

13 JAN

Judges 20:1-23

"But the Benjaminites would not listen to the voice of their brothers, the people of Israel." (v.13). What would you do if you have a Christian brother or sister who refuses to deal with a known sin? How can you help them towards the path of Christlikeness?

14 JAN

Judges 20:24-48

- 1. What is the difference between justice and revenge?
- 2. With the focus on loving people genuinely this year, how can you love others in spite of your differences and conflicts?

15 JAN

Judges 21

- 1. What does the way in which the Israelites view and treat women say about their view of people in general? Their view of God?
- 2. In what ways are your views of people not aligned with God's view of people? Be as specific as possible. What can you do to change this?

16 JAN

Ruth 1, 2

- 1. Ruth 1:18 says, "When she (Naomi) saw that she (Ruth) was determined to go with her, she (Naomi) said no more to her." Ruth receives no immediate affirmation for her committed love to Naomi. How do you respond when you love someone and aren't shown love and thankfulness in return? Who is your heart serving when you are loving others?
- 2. When it comes to relating to other people, what lesson from this story do you most need to apply? What changes can you make to open yourself up to friendships that cross barriers like race, age and religion?

17 JAN

Ruth 3

One emphasis in this chapter is that when we receive love, we share it. Naomi, Ruth, and Boaz became means by which God showed his love. What are the current opportunities you have to be a channel of God's love to those he's put in your life?

18 JAN

Ruth 4

What changes have occurred with Naomi and Ruth's situation from Ruth chapter one to chapter 4? How can we learn to trust God like Naomi and Ruth, even when things look bad at the beginning?

19 JAN

1 Samuel 1

- 1. Consider the characters Elkanah, Hannah, Peninnah and Eli, how were their relationships with each other and with God? Can you identify yourself with any of them? If so, what can you learn about yourself?
- 2. What have you learned about God, in the light of Hannah's struggles and how should you respond when God seems to be silent in your or other people's struggles?

20 JAN

1 Samuel 2

- 1. In Hannah's prayer of praise, what can you learn about God's character and work? How can this knowledge help/encourage you in your present circumstances?
- 2. Are there behaviors (of yours or of others close to you) that you tend to ignore? How is God encouraging you to respond differently?

How are you like Samuel? What kind of opportunities has God given you to speak the word of God into another person's life? How have you seen that bring forth light and life?

- 2. What attributes of God have you observed from this chapter? How will you respond?

1 Samuel 6

How does a holy reverence for God shape how we worship corporately in our local churches? How can you better prepare yourself to approach God in a more reverent posture? How can we avoid becoming presumptuous about God's presence and favor toward us like the Israelites did with the ark?

24 JAN

1 Samuel 7, 8

- 1. What are the elements of true faith and repentance?
- 2. In what areas in your life do you still seek to be the "king" of your own life?

Reflect on all the events that happened in the last 24 hours. Where do you see God's purpose in them?

26 JAN

List one area where you know what God wants but have difficulty trusting Him? List the ways He has confirmed His presence to help you. Or perhaps, list your fears and seek Him for extra strength from His presence to do them.
- 2. No one can please everyone! But God puts governments/people in place with authority over us for His purposes. What should our responses be.. to the office, the person and to God?

27JAN

1 Samuel 11


Is there anything in your life that you are not willing to trust God with? What have you been ignoring or pushing aside in hopes that it might go away? What is the next step of faith that you need to take?



Psalm 52

The wicked will not always prosper. What causes the downfall of the wicked? How can a person make God his or her "stronghold"? What is one area of your life that you have been controlling that you can entrust to God?

Psalm 56

What are the things that are true about God no matter what we are experiencing inside or outside? David has NOT been rescued or vindicated yet, but he was committed to doing what is right - to worship, to thank God IN the suffering. How do you worship IN suffering?

Psalm 120

- How do you typically deal with your frustrations with things in our culture that are not as they should he?
- 2. How is God calling you to see your place in the world as a Christian? What hope can we find in Psalm 120 that God will help us?

16 FEB

Psalms 140-142

Psalm 140

What prevents you from completely trusting God with your problems? How does this passage encourage you to put your trust in God?

Psalm 141

As you read Psalm 141, and note the raw emotion and passion with which David writes, can you say that you are as vulnerable in your prayers as David was in his prayers? Think of a time when you were desperate like David expressed in this Psalm. In what ways could you have trusted God more in that situation?

- 2. How can you develop that intimate knowledge of God so that you may act rightly? Consider singing the hymn "I want a principle within" by Charles Wesley for today's devotion.

In what ways do you see that God's favour was on David? How have you experienced God's favour on you?

20 FEB

Psalms 17, 35

Psalm 17

How have you experienced God acting on your behalf? How does David's conclusion of this psalm encourage you?

Have you ever been in a place where you felt like you needed God to act and act now, but instead, it seems like He's just standing still? How did it feel? What did you do?

What is the best course of action to follow when you are falsely accused, criticized, or slandered?

What are your fears? How does this passage encourage you to face your fears? What specific steps can you take this week to trust the Lord with your fears and problems?

What strikes you most about David's attitude in verses 3-5? How would you describe his posture in these verses, and why do you think so? How can you live a more worshipful life moving forward? In what areas of your life do you need to acknowledge and recognize Christ more?

1 Samuel 28, 29

- 1. How did King Saul sin against God? How might you have sinned in a similar way? Take some time to confess to God.
- 2. Why was David's rejection by the Philistines a blessing? Have you experienced rejection in the past that turned out to be a blessing? What does this reveal about God in your life?

1 Samuel 30

- 1. What can you do to strengthen your faith/confidence in the Lord?
- 2. How can you be like David in seeking God's will in your decision-making?

1 Samuel 31

How do you feel when you read about the death of King Saul? What has his tragic death taught you about your relationship with God?

Psalm 124

What would your life be like if God wasn't in it? Where would you be without God? Give God the glory for what he has done.

Psalm 125

How would you assess your trust in the Lord at this point in your life? What gives evidence of your trust (or lack of trust)? What would you like to see change?

28

Psalms 128-130

Psalm 128

How can a person prosper without becoming wealthy? What would you want God to do in our church, community, and nation? How do you sense God calling you to respond so that you can be part of a shift in a Godward direction?

Psalm 129

To follow after God, one must wrestle with some difficult decisions and emotions. How do you feel about verses 5-8 being in the Bible? How do these fit with "loving your enemy"? How do these fit with "casting off evil" and "clinging to what is good"?

Psalm 130

What are some practical ways that you can focus on heaven while still on earth?

What might you need to ask God to help you with this week?

Psalm 8

How have you built your life around God's glory or do you seem to want God to keep serving you? Explain. How have you grown or would like to grow?

06 MAR

Psalms 9, 10

Psalm 9

How should we pray when we are concerned about a wicked or unjust practice? What is one way you can contribute to a righteous cause or movement?

Psalm 10

What reasons might a person have for refusing to believe in the existence of God? What can you say to someone who perceives God as distant and does not care?

07MAR

Psalms 14, 16

Psalm 14

In your own life, when was a time when you were indifferent towards God, what was the outcome? How about when you were passionate? Though this psalm is about the atheist, in reality, it is about all of us, for we can all live like fools. Pray for yourself, that God will rekindle the flame and keep it burning.

Psalm 16

When many people think of God and Christianity, they think of being somber and giving up everything that is fun and enjoyable. Does v.11 surprise you that there is "fullness of joy" in God? If you are not experiencing joy, how can you be more joyful?

Psalm 19







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

ur church's vision is "Transforming Lives, Changing the World".

INTRODUCTION

'Transformed by the Word' is not just another Bible reading plan or routine.

In John 1:1-4, 14, we read that the Word was with God, and the Word was God. The Word existed from the beginning of time even prior to creation. This Word became human and lived among people. He possessed a glory that can only be described as the glory of God. This Word that became human is Jesus Christ our Lord.

'Transformed by the Word' is a tool that aims to facilitate a transformative encounter with the Living Word made flesh in Jesus.

The word "transformed" comes from the Greek word metamorphoo. It literally means "to change into another form". The process of a caterpillar morphing into a butterfly is a wonderful illustration of such a radical transformation.





Romans 12:2 teaches us that the renewal of our minds is the key for a transformed life. The fruit of our transformation is that we reflect the glory of God (2 Cor 3:18).

'Transformed by the Word' facilitates the renewal our minds through God's Word. As we meet God daily in His Word, we catch a glimpse of the glory of God and His heartbeat. As we contemplate God's teachings and choose to apply what we learn in our lives, the Holy Spirit produces in us the fruit of transformation that reflects His glory. What an exciting prospect!

Let us begin this journey together as a church family with an expectant heart that God will accomplish in us His work of transformation through the daily encounter of His Word.

The readings are arranged in chronological order of the Bible, with Psalms and Proverbs weaved inbetween to provide variety in our daily engagement with the Word. Reading in chronological order helps us grasp the big picture of God's salvation plan better.

Place and Time

Designate a regular time daily in an environment conducive to read the Bible and commune with God with minimal distraction.

Come Before God

Breathe deep and be silent. Take your time to let God quiet your mind and heart.

Begin to pray and remember you are here to encounter the Word, and to discover yourself.

The Bible

Read the Bible text slowly a few times. Take note of verses, phrases and words or big ideas that are speaking to you.

The Daily Questions

There are usually one to three questions. Listen to what God is asking you through these questions.

Note: These are not comprehension questions. They are designed to direct us into a deeper discovery of God, ourselves, and our relationships with Him and others. They will challenge us to apply God's truth into our lives with the help of the Holy Spirit.

If one of the questions is challenging you to go deeper, obey the Holy Spirit and see what He is revealing to you. The key is not in answering all the questions but in applying the Word into your life.

Other generic questions that may help you to apply the Word into your life:

- 1. From the passage, what aspect of your life is God revealing that requires transformation?
- 2. What is one thing that God is challenging you to do in your relationship with Him and with others?
- 3. Is there a command to obey, a sin to confess or avoid, a promise to claim, an example to follow, a truth to rejoice in, any thanksgiving to be given?







Continue in a posture of silence and wait as God reveals more things or confirms your prayers. Respond to God in prayer.

Periodical Review

It is extremely beneficial to review periodically how God has transformed you and give thanks to Him. A journal is a useful tool to review your journey and growth.

Iournal

Buy a good journal to record your reflections and prayers! Write or even draw what God has revealed or called you to do. Journalling is an important and useful private discipline that will help us to remember the discoveries about God, ourselves, and the applications that God is calling us to. You may also choose to journal electronically. There are many useful journalling apps that can be found in the AppStore (iOS) and the Google Play Store (Android).

Enjoy!!

Finally, enjoy your time with the Word. Like the psalmist said in Psalm 119:103 "How sweet are your words to my taste, sweeter than honey to my mouth!" May you have a daily sweet communion with God!

Find a buddy

We are never alone in our journey of faith! Find someone to journey with you - they could be your fellow Small Group member, a family member, a close friend, or even a colleague. Share how God's Word is speaking to or transforming you, to spur and encourage each other as you continue on this journey. Hold each other accountable in the reading and application of God's Word. And remember to celebrate how God is working in both your lives! Communion with God brings much joy into our life that is worth celebrating!

Missed Readings

Missed a day or two? Don't panic. Reading the Bible is not a legalistic practice. Just read the day's designated readings and catch up on what you missed when you are able to.
